- **DA Form 1058:** must be signed by the applicant, Commander & Records Custodian
- **Resume:** detailed
- **FTNGD Initial Counseling Form:** must be signed by the applicant and a unit representative
- **Evaluation Reports and Letters of Recommendation:** Include three most recent NCOER/OERs, a letter of recommendation must be submitted for Soldiers who do not have an Evaluation Report. For Soldiers that have Evaluation Reports, letters of recommendation are optional.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Attend Event Life Cycle (ELC) conferences to include the brigade's culminating training event, Annual Training Initial Planning Conference, prepare for the Main Planning Conference and Final Planning Conference and develop conceptual training objectives necessary for Concept Development Conference.
- Attend IDT and AT periods with HHC, 141 MEB and if required, training periods with their current unit of assignment.
- Plan and prepare the movement of all equipment and personnel necessary to support event life cycle events and significant training events.
- Assist and advise commander and staff on significant training dates, conferences, and training requirements to include Command Post Exercises and additional Mission Command System training to include CPOF (CPCE), DCGS-A, TAIS, AMDWS, and SIPR systems.
- Serve as the primary points of contact and liaison with subordinate units and MCTP.
- Maintain knowledge management for FTUS and M-day staff.
- Produce OPODs and plans necessary for training, operations, and logistics.
- Submit movement orders and ARTIMS as needed to facilitate unit travel requirements.

- Monitor Mission Command Training (MCT) portal for unit specific data and work with OPSGRP planners to synchronize planning efforts.
- Attend and facilitate all In Progress Reviews (IPRs), Technical Integration Working Groups (TWIGs), Life Support Working Groups (LSWGs), and facilitate subordinate / staff working groups.
- Supervise additional full-time employees.
- Coordinate with installations, facilities, agencies, and adjacent units to align exercise design and control and scenario framework.
- Understand Maneuver Enhancement Brigade capabilities within a decisive action environment, understand large scale combat operations, understand operational framework and the Maneuver Enhancement Brigade's role within the Support Area Command Post, and be familiar with doctrine updates to include but not limited to FM 6-0, FM 3-0, ADP 3-0, FM 3-81, and ADP 5-0.
- Other duties as assigned.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Be a current member of the North Dakota Army National Guard (NDARNG)
- Have current Physical Health Assessment (PHA)
- Meet Height to Weight Ratio standards
- Meet Army Fitness Test standards
- Have initial entry training completed
- Have less than 17 years Active Federal Service
